The law of April 13, 2016 recognizes prostitutes as victims. Clients are liable to a fine or a prison sentence if the prostitute is a minor. The fight against rings and pimping is reinforced.

This law **creates a path to get out of prostitution as well as social and professional integration**. It can be offered to you if you ask for it.

The approval for the commitment in this path is given by the Prefecture on the proposal of the referring association. The person must **commit to quit prostitution**. This path extends over a period of two years, with an evaluation and authorization to continue every 6 months.

Once committed to the path, you can benefit from assistance :

- ⇒ Support and care: social and professional integration path, access to healthcare, accommodation / housing.
- ⇒ An allowance: **Financial aid for social integration (AFIS)** if you do not benefit from minimum social benefits or aid for asylum seekers (RSA, ADA, ATA).
330 € per month (amount as of January 1, 2021); the amount varies according to the number of dependent children.
- ⇒ Issuance of a **Provisional Residence Permit (APS)**.
- ⇒ Issuance of a **Temporary Residence Permit** if you have filed a complaint against pimps or have testified in legal proceedings.
